Better ways to lodge your FBT return

You can lodge your FBT return:

- electronically, using your <u>Standard Business Reporting</u> ^[] (SBR)enabled software
- through your tax agent.

Electronic lodgments are generally processed within two weeks. Most paper lodgments are processed within 10 weeks.

To have a printed copy of the FBT return sent to you:

If you don't need to lodge an FBT return

You don't need to lodge an FBT return if you didn't have an FBT liability for the FBT year and you don't pay your liability by instalments.

Instead, send us a Fringe benefits tax – notice of non-lodgment (NAT 3094) by the time your return would otherwise be due. This will stop us seeking a return from you at a later date.
