Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission

The Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission (ACNC) is the independent national regulator of charities. Charities must register with the ACNC before they can receive charity tax concessions from the ATO. The ACNC also maintains the <u>ACNC Charity Register</u> which contains information about the more than 54 000 ACNC registered charities in Australia.

Australian Competition and Consumer Commission ☐

The Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (ACCC) is an independent Australian Government statutory authority. It was formed in 1995 to administer the *Trade Practices Act 1974 and the Prices Surveillance Act 1983*. The ACCC promotes competition and fair trade in the market place to benefit consumers, business and the community. It also regulates national infrastructure services. Its primary responsibility is to ensure that individuals and businesses comply with the Commonwealth competition, fair trading and consumer protection laws. In fair trading and consumer protection, its role complements that of the state and territory consumer affairs agencies which administer the mirror legislation of their jurisdictions, and the Competition and Consumer Policy Division of the Commonwealth Treasury. The ACCC maintains the SCAMwatch website which explains how to recognise, avoid and report scams>

Australian Cyber Security Centre ☐

The Australian Cyber Security Centre (ACSC) leads the Australian Government's efforts to improve cyber security. Our role is to help make Australia the safest place to connect online.

Australian Financial Security Authority ☐

The Australian Financial Security Authority (AFSA) is the government agency responsible for the administration and regulation of the personal insolvency system in Australia. AFSA operates the

bankruptcy registry, where debtors petitions are lodged, debt agreement proposals are processed and public records on personal insolvency are maintained. The purpose of AFSA is to provide a personal insolvency system that produces equitable outcomes for debtors and creditors, enjoys public confidence and minimises the impact of financial failure on the community.

Australian Prudential Regulation Authority

The Australian Prudential Regulation Authority (APRA) is the prudential regulator of banks, insurance companies and superannuation funds, credit unions, building societies and friendly societies.

Australian Securities and Investments Commission <a>I

The Australian Securities and Investments Commission (ASIC) is an independent government body that enforces and administers corporations law and consumer protection law for investments, life and general insurance, superannuation and banking (except lending) throughout Australia. Their purpose is to reduce fraud and unfair practices in financial markets and financial products so consumers use them confidently and companies and markets perform effectively.

Australian Trade and Investment Commission

The Australian Trade and Investment Commission (Austrade) is the Australian Government's international trade promotion and investment attraction agency. We generate market information and insights, promote Australian capability, and facilitate connections through our extensive global network.

This site provides government information and transactions for people operating a business (or planning to start a business) and their advisers. You can apply for an Australian business number (ABN) electronically, and search for a business's ABN on this site.

ComLaw 🖸

ComLaw is the legal information retrieval system owned by the Australian Attorney General's Department. It contains up-to-date electronic versions of all Commonwealth legislation.

Commonwealth Ombudsman 🖸

The Australian Commonwealth Ombudsman investigates complaints about Australian Government departments' and agencies' actions to see if they are unlawful, wrong, unjust or discriminatory. The Commonwealth Ombudsman is also the Australian Capital Territory

(ACT) Ombudsman. The ACT Ombudsman investigates complaints about ACT Government agencies.

Department of Agriculture [2]

Department of Home Affairs ☐

Home Affairs brings together Australia's federal law enforcement, national and transport security, criminal justice, emergency management, multicultural affairs, settlement services and immigration and border-related functions, working together to keep Australia safe

Visit myaccount to search for social and health related services online, find your nearest Human Services office and access calculators and other online tools. If you are registered with more than one Human Services agency, you can create a single sign-on at myaccount. Once you have created a single sign-on, you only have to login once to access Centrelink, the Child Support Agency and Medicare Australia online.

Fair Work Ombudsman

The role of the Fair Work Ombudsman is to give advice and help employees, employers, contractors and the community understand their workplace rights and responsibilities. They also investigate workplace complaints and enforce compliance with Australia's workplace laws.

Some investigations result in the Fair Work Ombudsman receiving payments from employers for outstanding wages and entitlements. You can search the Fair Work Ombudsman's unpaid wages database to find out if your former employer paid the Commonwealth money that was owed to you.

Foreign Investment Review Board

The Foreign Investment Review Board (FIRB) is a non-statutory body that advises the Government on foreign investment policy and its administration. The Board examines proposals by foreign interests to undertake direct investment in Australia and makes recommendations to the government on whether those proposals are suitable for approval under the government's policy.

Inspector-General of Taxation ☐

The objective of the Inspector-General of Taxation is to improve the administration of the tax laws for the benefit of all taxpayers. The sole focus for the Inspector-General is on tax systems rather than individual taxpayer matters.

IP Australia 🖸

IP Australia is the government agency responsible for the registration of patents, trade marks and designs. This site contains information about how to protect and gain maximum benefit from your intellectual property.
