



COVID-19 early release of super interim report: 2019–20 applications

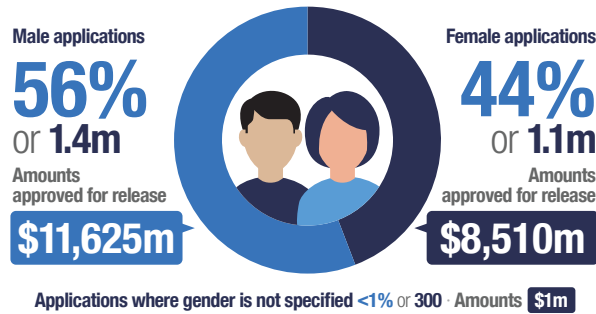
In the 2019–20 financial year eligible individuals adversely financially affected by COVID-19 were able to apply online through myGov between 20 April 2020 and 30 June 2020 to access up to \$10,000 of their super.



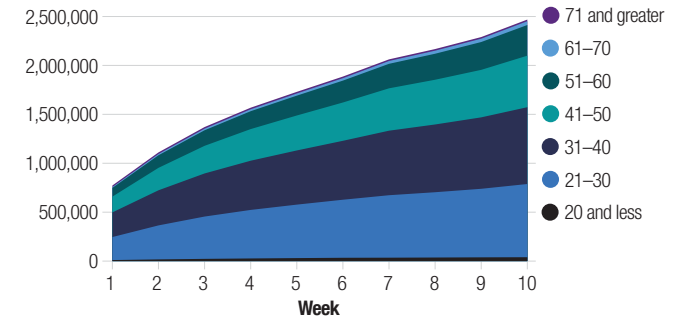
Approved applications by fund type



Approved applicants by gender



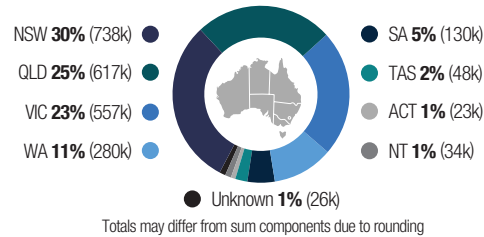
Approved applicants weekly by age



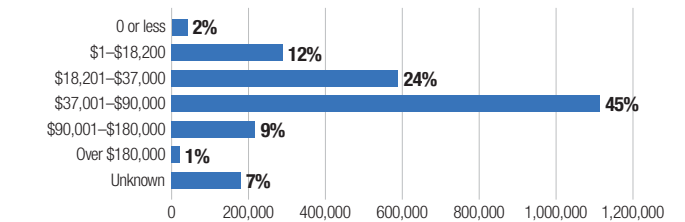
Approved applicants by residency status



Approved applicants by state and territory



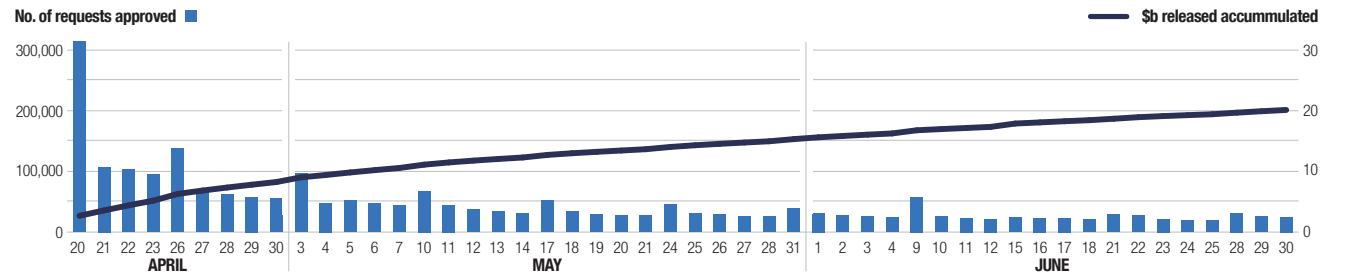

Notes: Amounts approved for release by the ATO may differ to the amounts released by funds. Rejected applications are where an individual has attempted to submit multiple applications in the same financial year. Applications may also be suspended where errors have been made, and in some cases these are later cancelled, rejected or approved. The income range is based on the latest tax return data (from the last two years) at the time of the ERS application. Income ranges for applicants may have changed since their last tax return was lodged. Around 19,000 applications were cancelled due to errors or because clients withdrew them.
